





"In the absence of a true cure, the most effective treatment for autism lies no further than our family and friends."

Founded in 2004 by Irene and David Bodanis, Jake's House was originally inspired by their experience after two of their three sons were diagnosed with autism. They felt the helplessness, the loss of dreams and the isolation firsthand. With a genuine understanding of the profound impact autism has on a family, Irene and David set out to better prepare others for the challenges that arise and to build a strong compassionate community of support.

They began by welcoming everyone into their family-and they gathered them together in one room at the first-ever Jake's House Holiday Party. Two decades later, this celebration remains an annual tradition, and the Jake's House family has grown exponentially.

AWARENESS & ASSESSMENT

BUILDING A SENSE OF BELONGING

Festive parties. Family dinners. Golf Tournaments. Trips to Disney World. Community outings. Concerts and more. It's no exaggeration to say that the first pillar of Jake's House support forms the very foundation on which the charity was built.

An early survey conducted by the charity revealed that most parents identified their greatest concern as their child growing up without ever having had a single friend.

With this at the forefront, the charity focused on raising awareness and assessing the needs of families; ensuring individuals with autism could find support and connection within our Jake's House community became the priority. Over nearly 20 years, tens of thousands of individuals have participated in a Jake's House social event in some capacity. There have been countless events of all ranges and sizes. Whether it is attending one of our many awareness events across several Canadian cities, or taking part in initiatives designed to better understand and assess the needs of our families. It may have been an intimate evening for 3,000 with rock Legend Rodger Hodgson. Numerous hockey tournaments strongly supported by NHL Legends like Bobby Orr and Wayne Gretzky in the early days of Jake's House events. Dozens of golf tournaments supported by Corporate Canada and celebrities alike.

The list of events is too large to recall, all leading to our largest social inclusion effort to date - the creation of our very own Jake's House - ASD Band. Using the universal language of music to invite every single member of our Jake's House family to join the celebration as one.

Welcome one, welcome all.

SPREADING THE HOLIDAY CHEER

Children and families find a place to belong and celebrate with others who care.

For most families, the holidays are filled with joy and warm memories. But for children and families living with ASD, this time of year often feels lonely and isolating. Jake's House Co-Founders Irene and David Bodanis—whose middle son, Jake, was diagnosed with autism at a level that severely



affected his communication – understand first hand how difficult it can be for families on the spectrum to experience the holiday cheer.

Invitations quickly disappear to traditional family holiday events for those on the spectrum. Children with autism are not always able to follow the traditional customs and far too often, do not get invited back to family and community events. That is why Irene and David launched their first Holiday Party in Toronto for children and families living with ASD. The sponsored event included 75 guests, 25 children with autism, and a caring off-duty police officer for every child.

HOPE FOR FAMILIES

The Jake's House Holiday Party provides families with a complimentary safe, comfortable and inclusive environment to gather and connect with others. Children of all ages enjoy bouncy castles, cotton candy, arts and crafts, a holiday meal, and a special gift from Santa. With the help of sponsors and donors, who serve as honorary Jake's House helpers, also provides wish list items for local families—who would otherwise go without.

Over the years, the annual event grew in popularity. In 2019, Jake's House launched an additional Holiday Party in Ottawa to meet the increasing demand. That year alone, dedicated staff and volunteers welcomed 2,500 guests across both events. In 2022, the holiday joy and cheer expanded to Toronto, Ottawa, and now London. The hope is to continue growing the Jake's House Holiday Party to multiple cities across Canada.

LEGENDS MENTORING PROGRAM

EVERYONE DESERVES A FRIEND

The Legends Mentoring Program helps youth to build relationships with mentors and peers.

In 2009, Jake's House surveyed approximately 900 Canadian families and the most common concern amongst all caregivers for their children with ASD was social skills / friendship-based programming. Many caregivers voiced their fears of their children growing up without ever having a friend. For this reason, Jake's House designed the Legends Mentoring Program, matching individuals with ASD with personal advocates to understand, encourage and guide them.

Supported by the Government of Ontario, TD Bank, and Tim Hortons, Legends Mentoring Program is currently bringing individuals of all ages with ASD

and mentors together as groups to engage in friendship through fun and educational activities in social settings both in-person and virtually. These interactive workshops, collaboratively hosted by Jake's House and diverse community partners, are tailored to different interests and include themes, such as cooking, technology/coding, athletics, arts, travel and dancing.

Through Legends Mentoring Program (LMP), Jake's House provides personal support and social opportunities to individuals with autism. Paired with caring mentors, individuals with autism-or the mentees-gain a personal advocate to understand, encourage and guide them. Mentors and mentees spend regular, guality time together, developing relationships and sharing experiences that truly reward and can transform both sides.

BUILDING CONFIDENCE

Skill-based workshops help a teen with autism to explore new things and socialize with others.

As 13-year-old Jocelyn took a bite of the eggs and spinach on her plate, her mother watched in amazement. "Sometimes, children with autism can be very picky," explains her mother, Juana Moctezuma. "With the cooking classes, she started eating new foods."

Jocelyn is on the autism spectrum and began participating in the Legends Mentoring program after attending a Jake's House Holiday Party in 2019. "I liked making the guiche," she says of the culinary workshop she joined through the program. In this workshop, she met Sammy, a 23-year-old Jake's House volunteer. "I would say hi to him every time I entered the Zoom meeting," she says.

But it took time for Jocelyn to feel comfortable enough to interact with the group. During the first workshop, she left her camera off, only using the chat option to ask questions or share comments. Along with the other mentors, Sammy took time to interact with her personally and provided the oneon-one support she needed during the virtual sessions. When she later signed up for a second workshop, Jocelyn felt comfortable enough to turn on her camera - and even let her personality shine.

"I noticed an improvement in her confidence and her self-esteem grew and grew as the weeks went on," says Sammy. Jocelyn also began interacting with other youth by sharing knock-knock jokes in the chat. She has since participated in several other workshops, including arts and crafts, and building.

"We are very grateful for Jake's House. Everybody is very patient and kind," says Juana. "The workshops don't just benefit the kids. It's beneficial for the whole family."

EMPLOYMENT TRAINING PROGRAM

EMPOWERING POTENTIAL

An innovative, adaptable program that supports the integration of individuals aged 16+ years with autism or a neurodiversity, into the workforce.

The Jake's House Employment Training Program (ETP) is a transformative initiative designed to help young adults with autism and neurodiversity thrive in the workforce.

Launched in 2019, historically funded federally and provincially, the program builds on the success of previous pilot initiatives and offers a range of support services for both candidates and employers. Through strategic partnerships with Corporate Canada, Jake's House connects candidates with meaningful employment opportunities . In partnership with LiUNA Canadian Tri-Fund and LiUNA Training Centres 183 and 837, tailored programs like the Construction Craft Worker Pre-Apprenticeship to enhance skill development for rewarding employment opportunities.

With many individuals already securing paid employment, the program is paving the way for greater workforce inclusion and long-term career success.

LIUNA PARTNERSHIP: EMPOWERING CAREERS IN CONSTRUCTIONS & SKILLED TRADES

In partnership with LiUNA Training Centres 183 and 837, eight individuals with autism or a neurodiversity successfully graduated from the Construction Craft Worker Pre-Apprenticeship Program.

Participants earned 12 essential certifications for careers in construction, gaining both technical skills and life skills. Our Pre-Apprenticeship Training Program focused on providing a supportive and inclusive learning environment that met the needs of neurodiverse individuals.

The 8-week program included a comprehensive curriculum that covered the essential skills and knowledge required to become a successful Construction Craft Worker. All participants were supported with complimentary transportation to ensure successful completion.

Proudly, within two weeks of completing the program, two graduates secured employment, with more following suit. A graduation ceremony celebrated their achievements, and Jake's House, alongside LiUNA, is excited to offer additional training programs in 2024 and beyond.



JAKE'S HOUSE EMPLOYMENT EXPOS

Jake's House hosted its first Employment Expos in Ottawa, London, and Toronto in 2023, providing individuals with autism and neurodiversity the tools to succeed in the workforce. Through personalized, hands-on support, participants gained skills in resume building, interview prep, and professional networking. The expos create a safe, relaxed space for learning, while connecting job seekers with employment opportunities.

Employers across all sectors including construction, manufacturing, technology, retail, public service and more support Jake's House, offering opportunities to those eager to kickstart their careers.

The Jake's House Employment Expo is designed to connect Corporate Canada's labour force and diversify its employment landscape.

SKILLS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (SDP)

In 2023, Jake's House trained 175 candidates through the 80-hour, four-week Skills Development Program. Held in Toronto, Ottawa, and London, the program equipped participants with essential life and employment skills, including communication, time management, resume building, and interview preparation, paving the way for workforce success.

70% of caregivers said the program helped participants recognize strengths and growth areas, building a foundation for career success. A parent of an ETP participant said that "The Employment Training Program has transformed my son's life. He now has a steady job and feels confident about his future. Watching him develop skills and build connections has been an incredible experience for our family."

INCLUSIVE HOUSING **PROGRAM**

HOPE FOR A BETTER FUTURE

Jake's House presents a unique housing model to address the current housing gap, providing a social solution that makes a real difference in families' daily lives.

Unveiled in 2020 and funded in 2021 by the Provincial government, Jake's House launched its Inclusive Housing Program with Jake's House Community Residences (JHCR), availing a 54-unit residence in Lucan, Ontario. Currently, 60% of the rooms are dedicated to adults living

with autism and developmental disabilities, while the remaining 40% are available to seniors. Each resident has access to customized meal plans, housekeeping support, transportation, social programs, activities and more.

The Inclusive Housing Program gives aging parents and caregivers peace of mind. With specialized care and services, their adult children living with autism will have the support they need to thrive as they age. The blend of caregivers / seniors along with members of the ASD community living together is a new concept to North America, developed using successful examples of similar concepts around the world.

A PLACE TO CALL HOME

Jake's House Community Residence - where love grows eternal for married couple.

"We got married at my mom and dad's place," Ruth fondly remembers. After meeting at the Special Olympics in 2016, Paul and Ruth dated for four years before getting married. This year, the couple celebrated their 22nd wedding anniversary. Paul still remembers all the things he liked about her at the time: "She was nice, good natured, fun to be around and outgoing."

Paul and Ruth each have a developmental disability. When the couple first got married, they lived together in a condo in Strathroy, Ont., and received regular support from nearby relatives. They later moved in with Paul's niece, Jeanette Wannamaker, in London, Ont. But when Jeanette became ill in 2020, she could no longer offer the care they needed.

As a family, they searched for appropriate housing for Paul and Ruth, but nothing was available. And it if a spot on the DSO housing wait list opened up, it would likely be a single-occupancy unit. The couple would have no choice but to live apart.

The housing crisis facing Canadians with developmental disabilities has been on the rise for several years. In Ontario, over 28,000 adults



with developmental disabilities were on the wait list for residential services as of 2023. According to information from the Ontario Developmental Services Housing Task Force, that number climbed to 15,700 by 2017.

"We were told that it would be many years, if ever, that a placement for a married couple would open up," says Jeannette. "It was a true miracle when we got the call about Jake's House!"

On New Year's Eve in 2021, Paul and Ruth were grateful to begin a new chapter of their livestogether. With the support of their family, they moved in and became the first married couple to call JHCR home.

"I'm diabetic and I have a lot of problems, like with my foot and my eye," says Ruth. "I'm so happy that I'm here. The nurses help me out a lot."

Although Paul and Ruth no longer live with Jeanette, she is very involved in their lives. Staff send her regular updates and emails, and the family is invited to participate in workshops and events.

Tammy Brownlee, Director of Care at JHCR, says families are encouraged to play an active role in the lives of residents. "They are not just dropping their loved ones off and then not having anything to do with them," says Tammy. "They are a part of the process the whole way through."




